


Naujoji Vilnia branch library's children and youth day centre services are targeted towards socially excluded family and children.








The purpose of the services is to build harmonious relationships in families and strengthen mental health using a gaming environment and playful "avatar" images.










A professional psychologist-educator uses a PC and virtual reality for group bibliotherapy sessions






Participants create personal avatars to join the virtual platform

















Also, everyone can connect to the platform at any time for individual activities, e.g., to create their personal islands – virtual spaces – and to communicate with each other virtually or by texting

Facing crises



The results and impact

Since the launch in 2016, 346 children and 227 adults benefitted from bibliotherapy sessions

2021 online survey found:

The psychological discomfort of near 60% of the children was reduced after the first 5 sessions, during which they were able to form a more positive attitude towards themselves, their friends and family.

Up to 80% of children indicated that sessions have helped them to build communication skills, and to solve emotional, behavioral, and relationship problems.

Recognition

2020 - the Ministry of the Interior of Lithuania has named the library's virtual bibliotherapy platform as The Best Initiative in the Vilnius region that effectively reduces psychosocial problems by using game elements.

2021 – the "15min" – one of the biggest news and media portal in Lithuania – has selected the library's virtual bibliotherapy platform to be supported by their end-of-the 2020 campaign, among the 24 kindness initiatives that lead changes in the country.

We are delighted to name four winners of the 16th EIFL Public Library Innovation Award, for Public libraries enabling learning through play.



We use data-driven programs to restore and serve our community. Hepa Jam, a Book Bunk initiative, is an after-school program that encourages play and engagement with library users, in partnership with The LEGO Foundation..

In partnership with Care for Education and The LEGO Foundation, ten Book Bunk staff members participated in a training session on June 20th and 21st, 2022. The training equipped them with ideas for engaging library users in fun learning activities using LEGO bricks.



On May 14th, 2022, we held an internal staff play day for all team members and library users. This event provided us with the opportunity to test, benchmark, and prepare for future play days.










We now offer weekly play days at the libraries, on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays. During these events, play areas are set up at the Kaloleni and Eastlands libraries, inviting children and adults to engage in play.

Play Bunk Lessons



Children make up the majority of attendees for Play at the Library. We adjusted the schedule of these events to align with the school calendar, as this heavily influences their attendance.







Lessons from Play Bunk



LEGO play sets have been a hit with children, including those with physical disabilities such as visually and hearing impaired children. We saw this firsthand on July 16th, 2022, at the Kaloleni Library, and it is a promising start towards making our libraries more inclusive and accessible to everyone.





By introducing local games such as 'kati', hopscotch, and jump rope, among others, we have significantly increased overall engagement of both children and adults in Play at the Library events.

Lessons from Play Bunk





Currently, our largest audience for Play at the Library events is children between the ages of 4 and 16 years.








Children and teenagers in our libraries are thoroughly enjoying the play sessions and look forward to them. On Saturdays, we offer dance and music sessions for 35 children, who quickly make their way to the LEGO play set up as soon as their sessions are finished.

Jamhuri at the Library



Our annual party at the library which is held on December 12th at the Kaloleni Social Hall to celebrate Kenya and mark the end of Book Bunk's calendar of events for the year. This event typically attracts approximately 700 members of the Eastlands community and features a variety of activities, including film screenings, book readings, face painting, arts and crafts, tree planting, community feedback sessions, music and dance performances, lunch, and goody bags. In 2022, we added a series of games and play activities to the event.



Our formula

- 1. Identify a problem in your community that bothers you the most.
- 2. Mix this with what motivates you, what you are passionate about, and what you are good at.
- 3. Apply the Lean Startup Cycle to determine what works: start cheap, test cheap, fail cheap, and try again.
- 4. Connect youth and projects to experts and allies to provide mentorship and guidance.





THE RESULTS

- Around 700 children have participated in the programme to date.
- Children gain reading comprehension skills and improve their social skills, independence, interaction, and self-esteem.
- They explore their feelings and how to express themselves.



THE RESULTS

- Visits increased by 17%.
- Number of children in the workshops increased by 32%.
- The circulation of books for compulsory school classes increased by 15%
- The collective membership increased by 2.5%.



THE IMPACT

- Children became more active users of the library.
- Children report that they like playing in the library, having the freedom to read, and making their own predictions and opinions about books.
